



TOUCH FOOTBALL AUSTRALIA ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION PLAN

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Overview

This document provides a simple overview of what steps will be taken by Touch Football Australia (TFA) and ASADA to educate athletes about their anti-doping rights and responsibilities.

ASADA is tasked to support, encourage, develop and implement initiatives that increase the skills and knowledge of people involved in sporting activities about anti-doping matters.

TFA is the peak body for the sport of Touch Football in Australia. As such, they are best placed and have responsibility for ensuring all of their athletes are educated on anti-doping matters.

By working together, TFA and ASADA aim to ensure all members, particularly those in the high performance pathway, have access to consistently high quality anti-doping education.

Touch Football Australia Anti-Doping Education Plan

Taking into consideration the structure of the sport, staffing resources available, and the support and services provided by ASADA, TFA plans to undertake the following activities in order to educate its members about anti-doping issues:

Audience	Activity	Target
National Open teams/squads	<p>ASADA eLearning: mandate all members (including support personnel) of any team representing Australia to complete level 1 and 2 online certification before departure.</p> <p>Face to face: Where appropriate, TFA will present relevant anti-doping information in a face to face environment as a follow up to the information gained online. Alternatively arrange for an ASADA presenter to make the presentation.</p>	100% of members hold current level 2 certificates.
National Youth teams/squads	<p>ASADA eLearning: all athletes and attending private coaches selected to a training squad (for example the u/17 squad), will complete level 1 online</p> <p>Face to face: TFA will present at all Junior High Performance training camps or alternatively arrange for an ASADA presenter to make the presentation.</p>	100% of members hold level 1 certificate.
Elite Eight teams	<p>ASADA eLearning: mandate all members (including support personnel) of Elite Eight teams at National Touch League to complete level 1 and 2 online courses before competing in competition matches.</p>	100% of members hold current level 2 certificates.

AusSquad Junior Development Program	ASADA eLearning: all athletes and support staff, will complete level 1 online.	100% of members hold level 1 certificate.
State Programs	ASADA eLearning: All state programs and underpinning squads will be requested to complete minimum level 1 certification. This will be a mandatory requirement for members of State Programs.	100% State Program members hold level 1 certificate.
Staff and Board Members	ASADA eLearning: mandate all staff members and current board members to have completed both level 1 and 2 online	100% of staff hold current level 2 certificates.
National Event Participants	TFA will ensure that all entrants in any national level event (including junior and all-school championships) are aware of the possibility of doping control being conducted, and will ensure sufficient information is available to competitors on their rights and responsibilities. Offer educational opportunities as an option for athletes and support personnel to attend	

ASADA's Commitment

ASADA will:

- Partner with TFA to develop an anti-doping education program that meets their needs.
- Design, develop and provide accessible anti-doping education solutions.
- Ensure that the content is correct and adequate as well as provide reports and verification of participation.
- Develop or fund development of e-learning, to ensure consistency.
- Report on the progress of athletes in the online learning system.

Evaluation and reporting

ASADA will report back to TFA as requested regarding the number of members from their sport using the ASADA eLearning system.

TFA commits to ensure that records of attendance at any workshops or presentations conducted by the sport will be collected and forwarded to ASADA for filing.

ASADA and TFA will discuss annually the education conducted in the previous twelve months, identifying areas for improvement and re-planning for the next year.

TFA will assist ASADA's monitoring of the satisfaction and effectiveness of education programs by responding to ASADA's annual stakeholder survey as well as encouraging their athletes and members to do the same.

Education Resources

ASADA eLearning	ASADA's eLearning system designed to provide participants with the opportunity to learn about core anti-doping topics. Athletes and support personnel can access a range of training courses and tests.
Train the Trainer workshop	ASADA will be implementing train the trainer workshops suitable for those wishing to facilitate anti-doping sessions in their sport. Invitations will be sent to NSO's when sessions are being planned.
Social Media	Aside from the ASADA website (www.asada.gov.au) which provides core anti-doping information, athletes and other interested parties can stay up-to-date with anti-doping issues via ASADA's twitter and facebook pages.
Trade Stands	A highly visible education booth including anti-doping quizzes and prize giveaways. Most appropriate for large mass participation events and organised on application to ASADA.
ASADA Publications	ASADA publications are generally available online free or delivered for a cost (some items are delivered free of charge – please check): Athlete Testing Guide booklet, Check Your Substances booklet, Check Your Substances flier, Dangers of Doping flier, Posters, Wallet Cards.
Communication tools	A number of tools are available for NSO's to promote anti-doping including buttons/links for websites and print ready ads for publication.

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
