Α	DEFINITIONS
Item 1	2023 WA State Touch Football Championships
	The 2023 WA State Touch Football Championships is the premier state tournament conducted by Touch Football WA and is the prime vehicle in the talent identification and national selection processes for State representative teams at all levels.
ltem 2	Touch Football WA
	Touch Football WA (TFWA) is the state controlling body of the sport and the owner of the Touch Football WA State Championships.
Item 3	Touch Football Australia
	Touch Football Australia (TFA) is the national controlling body of the sport.
Item 4	Affiliate
	Affiliate means a local association that conducts and/or administers Touch Football competitions and which is a member of Touch Football WA.
Item 5	State Championship Affiliate
	A State Championship Affiliate is an approved team to compete in the competition.
Item 6	Invitational Team
	An Invitational Team is a team that has been invited to compete at the Touch Football WA State Championships. When competing at the Touch Football WA State Championships an invited team is subject to all Conditions of Entry, policies and guidelines as implemented by Touch Football WA to conduct the tournament.
Item 7	State Championships Affiliate Contact
	The person appointed by the Affiliate to act on behalf of the State Championship Affiliates, responsible for liaising with Touch Football WA relating to the State Championship Affiliates and the Touch Football WA State Championships. It is recognised that the Affiliate contact has the delegated authority of the State Championship Affiliates and can make decisions including financial ones without consultation.
Item 8	Officials
	Officials are referees, coaches, managers, Affiliate contacts, medical staff and any other person appointed to a position of responsibility in a State Championship Affiliate or the Touch Football WA State Championships.
Item 9	Doping Policy
	The Touch Football WA Doping policy is the policy determined by the TFA Board of Management (BOM), which relates to Touch Football WA's position on all doping practice matters. The latest copy is available on the TFA website.
Item 10	Code of Conduct
	The TFA Code of Conduct determined by the TFA relates to Touch Football WA's position on all behavioural matters of participants at Touch Football WA controlled events or representative team members.

	The venue is: UWA Sports Park Stephenson Ave, Mt Claremont Western Australia The dates of the competition will be: Friday, 10 February to Sunday, 12 February 2023 • Please note that there is no vehicle access permitted onto the grounds.
Item 2	Tournament Fees
	The Tournament levy is \$1,650 (GST Inclusive) per team Touch Football WA Affiliates.
	The Tournament levy is \$1,950 (GST Inclusive) per team for invitational teams.
	All Team Nomination Fees are due by 5:00PM Friday, 27 January 2023. Draws will only be confirmed when all fees have been paid.
	Levies that are late will be treated as a late entry and will incur a late payment fee as indicated in Item 11.
Item 3	Team Eligibility
	A State Championship Affiliate is an approved team to compete in the competition.
	Teams eligible to participate in the WA State Touch Football Championships are to be representatives of Touch Football Australia (TFA) registered Affiliates that are based in Western Australia (WA).
	Affiliates are required to meet all requirements of the TFA Affiliate Regulations.
	Affiliates are required to apply for permission to enter more than one team in each division. This will be adjudicated on a case by case basis and TFWA decision will be final. A criteria will issued to any applying affiliate.
	Invitational teams must be endorsed by their respective state or national body and are <u>not eligible</u> to contest any finals in any division at the 2023 WA State Touch Football Championships.
	All participants at the 2023 WA State Touch Football Championships must be fully financial members of Touch Football WA (TFWA) (or in the case of invitational teams, fully financial members of TFA or for international teams, the Federation of International Touch (FIT).
	All participants including players, officials (both team and referees), their current Affiliate and invitational teams must all be fully financial with TFWA by 5:00PM Monday, 30 January 2023 and abide by the laws and by-laws of TFA.

	If teams from your Affiliate have competed in the Men's and/or Women's Open divisions at this year's Super League tournament you are required to enter a Men's and/or Women's open side for the State Championships before you are eligible to enter a Mixed Open side.
Item 4	Player Eligibility
	It is the responsibility of each Affiliate being represented to ensure that all of their players and officials are affiliated and financial members of a registered TFA Affiliate, or meet the pool player requirements as determined by TFWA.
	Participants who are not financial will be known as 'unfinancial' and as such will be seen as unregistered participants. If the team plays with an 'unfinancial' member, all points may be deducted.
	All players must be active members of an Affiliate and must have played a minimum of five games for the same team in the 'Normal' competition of that Affiliate in the current season, Season 1 / 2022 or Season 2 / 2022 prior to the 2023 WA State Touch Football Championships. In this instance, to qualify, they must have participated in five games in the one team, in one division, at the one venue with the one TFA affiliate on five separate playing dates. The staging of qualification knockouts, tournaments or competitions over a three day weekend or successive weekends does not qualify the player to meet the five game criteria.
	The word 'Normal' in this situation refers to the competition dates your Affiliate has listed for their regular competition. Section four of this document entails the competition commencement and finish dates of each Affiliates seasonal competition as well as the nominated week days that the Affiliate competition will take place. The dates that have been listed, is what constitutes the Affiliates 'Normal' competition.
	In extenuating circumstances, the State Championship Affiliate may ask permission to field a player not meeting the criteria above to participate in the 2023 TFWA State Championships. A Dispensation Request form must be submitted to TFWA by 5:00PM Friday, 20 January 2023.
	A player may only represent one Affiliate. If a player is a financial playing member at more than one Affiliate during the current season, Season 1/2022 or Season 2/2022 then the player must decide which Affiliate they will represent.
	In the 12 months prior to a TFWA State Championships a Player may be able to represent more than one State Championship Affiliate.
	A player must be an active playing member of their State Championship Affiliate except if the player is a "Home Grown" or "Import" Player.
	If a Player accepts a position in a State Championship Affiliates team or squad, that State Championship Affiliate may refuse the players release to play for any other State Championship Affiliate. Acceptance would be determined as a signed written agreement between the Player and State
	Championship Affiliate.
	Any person currently serving a suspension at Affiliate level during the dates of the tournament is ineligible to participate for the duration of that suspension.
	Home Grown Status: Recognition as a "Home Grown" player is the State Championship Affiliate or other recognised entity at which they first represented at any State Event held within Australia in any age division.
	An individual can have only one "Home Grown" State Championship Affiliate.
	Special consideration to determine a player's "Home Grown" status can be made upon written request to TFWA. All requests must be lodged TFWA Office by 5:00PM Friday, 20 January 2023.
	After this date a list of these players will be sent out to all Affiliate Presidents and any issues or challenges to these "Home Grown" players must be supported by evidence and lodged by 5:00PM Friday, 27 January 2023.
	Where there is a dispute between State Championship Affiliates, TFWA is to determine "Home Grown" status although assistance may be sought from other State and/or National offices in the determination.

	State Championship Affiliates are required to supply their own medical staff for the treatment minor injuries. It is the State Championship Affiliates' responsibility to ensure that their medica staff possesses adequate qualifications and insurances.

	Each State Championship Affiliate must supply at least 1.5 suitably qualified referees per team (as indicated below) for the duration of the event (these figures will be rounded up to the nearest whole number). Equally all Affiliates are responsible for developing referees, coaches and athletes that attend the event.

	STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AFFILIATES WILL ONLY BE PERMITTED TO ENTER THE APPLICABLE NUMBER OF TEAMS ACCORDING TO HOW MANY REFEREES THEY HAVE NOMINATED. TEAM NOMINATIONS THAT RESULT IN THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AFFILIATES BEING UNDER THEIR REQUIRED REFEREE QUOTA MAY NOT BE ACCEPTED OR A FEE IMPOSED (see below).
	In the instance that a State Championship affiliate is still unable to support the required number of referees, then a specific plan for development will be implemented in consultation with the WA State Manager and State Referee Program Panel. A potential option to extend an invitation to Level 1 accredited referees to meet the above requirements may be offered on a case-by-case basis.
	IF ANY STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AFFILIATE CANNOT PROVIDE THEIR REFEREE QUOTA A \$500.00 FEE WILL BE APPLIED PER REFEREE. \$350.00 OF THIS MONEY WILL BE SUPPLIED TO AN INTERSTATE OF ADDITIONAL REGIONAL REFEREE, THE REMAINING \$150.00 WILL BE DIRECTED TO PROVIDING REFEREE DEVELOPMENT FOR THAT WA AFFILIATE (on a case-by-case basis)
	If a referee is nominated, then withdraws they will be need to be replaced by the Affiliate. If they are not replaced a fine of \$500 (GST Exclusive) may be imposed on the State Championship Affiliate.
	In conjunction with the State Referee Panel, Touch Football WA has clarified the different referee types and how they affect numbers supplied by each Affiliate towards their referee quota. The criteria is outlined below:
	• Full-time Referee – a Referee who is available for the entire three (3) day duration of the event.
	• Part-time Referee – a Referee who is not available for the entire three (3) days but is available for part of the event (part of one or more days and/or available the whole day for one or two days); and
	• Player Referee – a Referee who is also playing/coaching/managing in the event.
	There is a limit of three (3) Player Referees per Affiliate allowed to be nominated for this event. The three (3) Player Referees will be the equivalent of one (1) Full-time Referee when assessing the Affiliate's ability to meet the Referee quota. There is no maximum number of Part-time referees as long as their collective availability covers the three days of the event.
Item 10	Insurance
	The TFA Accident Insurance Scheme covers all players and officials who have met the insurance criteria of a TFA Affiliated competition. For this tournament the player must be a registered player in a WA Affiliate, or an accepted Pool Player, and their fees have been paid in full for the current season.
	Invitational teams must provide evidence of their own insurance coverage. If TFWA determines that the insurance coverage does not match their own, they must purchase insurance from TFA for the duration of the tournament.
Item 11	Late Entries
	Team Nomination Forms received after the relevant closing date will only be accepted at the convenience of the competition (i.e. to replace a bye or another withdrawal) and will incur a late payment of \$100 (GST Exclusive).
Item 12	Refunds
	No refunds will be provided to any team or participant that withdraws after the close of nominations.
	A full refund will apply to teams that are not able to play due to insufficient number of teams nominating to make a division active. This will be determined two weeks after the close of nominations.
Item 13	Registration Process
	It is the responsibility of each Affiliate being represented to ensure that all of their players and officials meet the eligibility criteria of the tournament.
	Teams can upload their details online via My Sideline. Upon receipt of the Team Nomination Form, individual Affiliate codes and instructions on how to comply with this method will be distributed.

	Each individual player and official will need to complete their own online registration. The online registration process also includes the completion of the Membership & Participant Declaration.
	Teams may register up to:
	<ul> <li>16 players per team for the Open Divisions</li> <li>18 players per team for Over-Age Divisions</li> <li>Minimum of ten players per team for all divisions</li> </ul>
	Players must have uploaded their details by 5:00PM Monday, 6 February 2023. As a minimum, all data fields must be completed for ten players- otherwise the team may be withdrawn from the tournament.
	A report on the registered players in each team will be emailed to the Affiliate Contact. This will contain only details of players uploaded online until Monday, 6 February 2023. This is the opportunity to make any final changes to the document. These changes are to be hand-written legibly on the report. Once the Affiliate Contact is happy with the document, they are to sign off on its accuracy.
	No deletions, additions or replacements will be permitted after Monday, 6 February 2023. Any changes to playing numbers after this time may result in a \$20 (GST exclusive) fine per offence and must be submitted by the Affiliate Contact.
	Touch Football WA must be made aware of changes or issues as soon as possible. This however does not exclude application of the fine.
	All Open teams must comply with the points system.
	Participants will also need to accept the Participant Declaration during the online registration process. This acceptance must be completed by all participants including players, team officials and referees. It is the responsibility of the respective State Championship Affiliate to ensure that all their participants have completed all online requirements before taking part in the tournament in any capacity. If Touch Football WA finds issues with the acceptance of the Participant Declaration, it could result in fines or further action.
	Team Lists of all Touch Football WA State Championship Affiliates must be endorsed by Touch Football WA and invitational teams must be endorsed by their respective state or national body.
	It is the responsibility of the respective State Championship Affiliate to ensure that all their participants have submitted all relevant documentation before taking part in the tournament in any capacity. If Touch Football WA finds issues with the paperwork, it could result in fines or further action.
ltem 14	Player Pool
	There will be an opportunity for players to nominate to play in the competition if they come from a State Championship Affiliate that is not sending a team in that particular division. It is not available to unsuccessful players from a State Championship Affiliate who has a team entered.
	Before entering the Player Pool, teams should be aware that applying for players from the Player Pool is no guarantee that they will pick up the number or individual(s) they requested.
	Similarly, players should also be aware that nominating for the Player Pool is no guarantee that they will be picked up by a team, the team that they requested or with other individuals they requested.
	Players nominating for the Player Pool must play for the team they have been allocated too. Player Pool Nomination Forms (players wanting teams) must be submitted to TFWA Office by 5pm Friday, 20 January 2023 and are available on the Touch Football WA website.
	Player Pool Application Forms (teams wanting players) must be submitted to TFWA Office by 5pm Friday, 20 January 2023 and are available on the Touch Football WA website.
	The Player Pool allocations will be advised by 5pm Friday, 20 January 2023. Pool players will be notified electronically by the State Championship Affiliate who they are allocated to.
	There will be one Player Pool process for the event. This will occur in January.

Eligible Players can nominate to TFWA and they will have the option of being selected by a State Championship Affiliate.
State Championship Affiliates can apply to receive Pool Players.
Where a State Championship Affiliate has chosen to not send teams in certain divisions, then they must assist players looking to participate to lodge an application to enter the pool. This provides access for participation for members who are willing to reach another team to participate. In this case the only way that a State Championship Affiliate can stop a participant accessing the pool is for financial liabilities or an issue of not being a current affiliated member of a local TFWA Affiliate. Players in this case can come to TFWA directly for clarification and assistance.
Teams can apply to receive some pool players but are required to have at least ten players before nominating for the competition or Player Pool. Teams can receive a maximum of four players from the Player Pool.
The Player Pool order of selection will occur as follows:
<ol> <li>The team that applies for players and finished last in the previous event in the corresponding division will have first choice of player.</li> <li>Then the second last team and so on.</li> </ol>
3) Teams that did not compete in the previous event in the corresponding division will have the last choice of player.
4) If more than one team did not compete in the previous event in the corresponding division, the team that finished last in the event two years prior and so on will have the first choice of player amongst teams not competing in the previous year.
5) If teams have not competed previously, teams will choose in alphabetical order. 6) Each team will have one choice per rotation.
<ul><li>7) New rotations will continue until all team's needs are met or there are no available players remaining in the pool.</li></ul>
Order of Allocation
The following will be the order that the divisions will be allocated:
a) Men's 40's b) Women's 40's c) Men's 30's d) Women's 30's e) Mixed 30's
Therefore, if someone nominated for the Men's 30's and Men's 40's and they were selected in picks during the Men's 30's allocation, they will be required to play for the Men's 30's team regardless if this was not their preferred division.
Pool Players can be utilised under the following guidelines:
<ul> <li>a) Pool players must have their nominations lodged with the State Championship Affiliate that they have trialled for in accordance with the TFWA State Championship timelines.</li> <li>b) Pool players will be notified electronically by the State Championship Affiliate who they are allocated to after the Player Pool allocations.</li> <li>c) TFWA will allocate individuals to teams utilising the above mentioned order of selection process.</li> <li>d) The limit that any one team can acquire from the pool is four players unless otherwise determined</li> </ul>
by TFWA. e) State Championship Affiliates can request directly to TFWA about recruiting players from outside of WA and these submissions will be granted on a case by case basis.
Players nominating for the Player Pool must play for the team they have been allocated too.
Similarly, State Championship Affiliates must allow allocated individuals to play for their team. Financial penalties may be imposed if this does not occur.
Any State Championship Affiliate that applies to Player Pool must notify TFWA the names of players for the proposed team and any shadows that were taken into consideration before they will be permitted to lodge an application for a Pool Player.

	If a participant is subject to any financial disputes and this has been documented in writing from the State Championship Affiliate via formal notification to TFWA, an appeal or any other Disciplinary Tribunal matters with an affiliate then that participant is ineligible to participate in the TFWA State Championships.
Item 15	Transfer of Players & Point Value
	The transfer system is designed to promote development within the boundaries of the State Championship Affiliate and indeed such development is rewarded. The concept is based on a points system where each State Championship Affiliate is allowed a certain number of points based on the TFWA Player Points and Transfer Guidelines.
	The guidelines for Open division players wishing to transfer to another Affiliate to compete in TFWA events are as follows:
	1. A player's existing Affiliate is the one that they last represented in the Super League Series or State Championships during the 18 month period prior to the commencement of the event for which the transfer is being sought.
	2. Players may choose which team they wish to transfer to, however the receiving team is strictly governed by the "Player Transfer Points System" (see below) whereby past and/or current Affiliate, state and/or national representative players attract points.
	3. Players who receive dispensation as an "import player" will also be considered under the "Player Transfer Points System", and TFWA will have other restrictions or conditions on such "import players" on a case by case basis.
	<ol> <li>Players who participated at the 2022 WA Super League Series are not permitted to transfer for the 2023 WA State Touch Football Championships.</li> </ol>
	5. Teams receiving one or more transferred players may only do so if they do not exceed a total of 100 points (for teams who competed in the previous season) or 150 points (for teams who did not compete in the previous season). Teams representing Affiliates/Regions more than 150kms from Perth will receive a points allowance of 150 points.
	6. A player is considered a 'transferred player' until the nomination due date for Super League the following year. The "Player Transfer Points System" will be enforced during this period.
	7. Players wishing to transfer to another Affiliate, with whom they would otherwise not be eligible to play, must complete a "Transfer" form.
	8. The player must submit the "Transfer" form (with the Player's Declaration already completed) to TFWA by 5pm Friday, 20 January 2023. Details of player transfers will be distributed by 5pm Friday, 27 January 2023 and any issues will be identified.
	9. The player submitting the transfer form should inform their Affiliate of their intention to transfer. All players must be cleared by their existing Affiliate of any financial, disciplinary or other matters and TFWA notified of the clearance for Transfer, otherwise the Transfer may be refused.
	10. Tournament Management has the right to disallow any Transfer/Dispensation and will review all player transfers in the interests of maintaining a fair competition, regardless of whether the team concerned complies with these guidelines.
	<u>Player Transfer Points System:</u>
	Points only apply to the players who are being transferred into the team, not for players who last represented the Affiliate concerned in an Open division, or who have never represented any other Affiliate. Players imported from outside Western Australia carry the applicable points every year in which they participate, as do players imported into an Affiliate team for which they remain ineligible.
	The points system and the ability to import players from interstate only applies to the Open divisions of the State Championships. All other divisions are subject to the player pool system.
	The highest applicable points will apply. For example, if a player competed in last year's Super League and they are also in the Australian Men's Open squad during the past 18 months, then that player would attract 50 points.

Drop-off:		
Should a Winner be required in drawn matches, the following Drop-Off procedure is used to determine a Winner.		
<ul> <li>Each Team will reduce their on-field Team to four (4) players and within 60 seconds take up a position to restart play from the Halfway Line, defending the same end of the field as at the End of Play.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>The Drop-Off commences with a Tap from the centre of the Halfway Line by the Team that did not commence the match with Possession.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>The Drop-Off will commence with a two (2) minute period of extra time.</li> </ul>		
• Should a Team be leading at the expiration of the two (2) minute period of extra time then that Team will be declared the Winner and Match complete.		
<ul> <li>Should neither Team be leading at the expiration of two (2) minutes, a signal is given and the match will pause at the next Touch or Dead Ball. Each Team will then remove another player from the Field of Play.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>The Match will recommence immediately after the players have left the field at the same place where it paused (i.e. the Team retains Possession at the designated number of Touches, or at Change of Possession due to some Infringement or the sixth Touch) and the Match will continue until a Try is scored.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>There is no time off during the Drop-Off and the clock does not stop at the two (2) minute interval.</li> </ul>		
• Substitution during the Drop-Off is permitted in accordance with normal Interchange Rules.		
• Mixed gender Teams may have no more than (2) males on the field during the Drop-Off.		
<ul> <li>In the case of a male player serving time in the Sin Bin at the commencement of the Drop-Off the offending Team will start with no more than one (1) male on the field.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Where a male player has been dismissed for the remainder of the match, the offending Team will be permitted to have no more than one (1) male on the field for the duration of the Drop- Off.</li> </ul>		
• At the commencement of the Drop-Off, if there is a player serving time in the Sin Bin and is yet to complete the required time, their Team commences the Drop-Off with one (1) less player on the field than their opposition and continues to play with one (1) player less until the Sin Bin		
period has been completed.		
<ul> <li>At the commencement of the Drop-Off, if a Team has had a player dismissed for the remainder of the match that Team continues to play with one (1) player less than the opposition Team for the duration of the Drop-Off.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>The non-offending Team will retain a numerical advantage on the Field of Play during the Drop- Off in the instance of a dismissed player.</li> </ul>		

	<b>Forced Interchange</b> Where the Referee deems it necessary to implement a Forced Interchange following an Infringement, the Referee is to stop the match, direct the ball to be placed on the Mark, advise the offending player of the reason for the Forced Interchange, direct that player to return to the Interchange Area, display the relevant signal and award a Penalty to the non-offending Team.
	<b>Stand-off</b> When a player from the Defending Team enters its defensive Seven Metre Zone the Defending Team must move forward at a reasonable pace until a Touch is Imminent or made.
	Ruling = A Penalty to the Attacking Team at the point of the Infringement.
	When a player in Possession enters the Defending Teams' Seven Metre Zone the Defending Team is not obliged to move Forward but cannot retire back towards their Try Line until a Touch is Imminent or made.
	Ruling = A Penalty to the Attacking Team at the seven (7) metre line in line with the point of the Infringement
	Sin Bin The on-field Referee is required to indicate the commencement and the end of the Sin Bin time. Any player sent to the Sin Bin must stand in the Sin Bin Area at the opposition's end of the Field of Play and on the same side as their Interchange Area. The player is counted as a player on the Field of Play and cannot be replaced or interchanged. A player is sent to the Sin-Bin Area for a period of four (4) completed possessions. Any player sent to the Sin Bin must return to the Interchange Area prior to re-entering the Field of Play. Any action that causes the Touch Count to restart will result in a continuation of that Possession. For the avoidance of doubt, should a defender knock the ball down or give away a Penalty, this does not mean that the Possession has been completed, but rather the Possession continues.
	Dismissal A player or official dismissed for misconduct is to take no further part in that match and is to move to and remain outside the Perimeter for the remainder of the match. The dismissed player or official cannot be replaced and, in accordance with TFA Disciplinary Regulations, that player shall receive an automatic two (2) match suspension.
Item 2	Tournament Management
	Touch Football WA Tournament Management will be in charge of all matters relating to this tournament. Touch Football WA will determine and/or interpret matters not covered by the Conditions of Entry and
	Touch Football WA decisions will be final. Touch Football WA has the right to amend any tournament rule if required.
	Tournament Management has a number of recognised processes available to support the overall management and conduct of the event. These processes may include informal and formal means and it is at the discretion of Tournament Management as to which avenues are used to eliminate issues or caution participants.
	Touch Football WA maintains various events records based on previous incidents and issues. These records can be drawn on when faced with a current issue or problem if they relate. All participants need to be aware of this process and understand that information can be carried over and applied if necessary.
	Furthermore, during an event there is often limited time available to complete written administrative tasks, therefore items such as recorders and templates are used to be time effective.
Item 3	Draw Formula
	After the close of nominations, an indicative draw will be distributed.
	The draft draw will only be distributed after team lists have been submitted and all nomination fees have been paid. An updated draw will be distributed to State Championships Affiliates with any additional draw changes advised as soon as possible.
	The final draw will be distributed by Friday, 3rd February 2023 pending the payment of Team Levies.

	All finals games must result in an outright winner. In the event of a drawn match at the end of full-time, a drop-off will determine the match winner.	
Item 5	Match Balls	
	All teams must use the official Match Ball in all games throughout the tournament. Footballs will be supplied by Touch Football WA to each team which can be collected at Tournament Control by a team official.	
ltem 6	Competition Points	
	For all round games, competition points will be awarded on the results obtained. The following points will be awarded	
	Win = Three (3) Points Draw = Two (2) Points Loss = One (1) Point	
	Forfeit = Zero (0) Points for the Offending Team	
	Bye = Zero (0) Points- If there are an equal number of byes allocated within the pool Bye = Three (3) Points-If there is an unequal number of byes allocated within the pool	
ltem 7	Forfeits	
	Teams that Forfeit less than a week out from the Tournament will receive a \$200 (GST exclusive) fine and Teams that Forfeit on the day of a match will receive a \$300 (GST exclusive) fine. These fines will be issued to the teams Affiliate.	
	Teams must be in attendance at their playing fields five minutes before the commencement of their round matches or advertised time for Grand Finals.	
	It is the responsibility of each captain to report to the referees two minutes before the commencement of their round games or advertised time for Grand Finals so that the toss of the coin can be affected without loss of time. If a team is not at the field at the appropriate time of the game, the attending team can be awarded the winning of the toss.	
	The offending team will receive a maximum of five minutes from the commencement of the game (siren/whistle) to position the team on the field and be ready to commence play.	
	If the offending team is not in attendance after the five minutes has expired, the game will be deemed a forfeit and the non-offending team will be awarded a 5 – 0 win and three competition points. The offending team will receive a score of 0 – 5 and no competition points. The offending team will be penalised one try after the first minute and one try for every minute thereafter up to five minutes.	
	The Affiliate Contact of an offending team will be required to give reasons in writing as to why their team should not be excluded from participating in any further matches. Tournament Management or an appointed Judiciary will decide upon receipt of the report if the offending teams' action warranted the need to forfeit the match and will incur a monetary fine of \$500 (GST exclusive). The team will then be ruled ineligible to participate in the respective final series. This written report must be submitted to Tournament Management before the completion of the timeslot relating to the forfeited match.	
	Forfeits in the Final Series	
	If a team is forced to forfeit in the final series, the respective Affiliate Contact must submit in writing the reasons for their forfeiture and it must be then approved by Tournament Management, or the following automatic penalties will apply:	
	<ol> <li>A monetary fine of \$500 (GST exclusive) will be imposed upon the forfeiting team, which will be invoiced to the relevant State Championships Affiliate, who is subsequently responsible to pay.</li> <li>The forfeiting team's overall standing will be demoted to last place in the pool and carry over to the following year when the new draw is completed.</li> </ol>	

	3. The State Championships Affiliate of the forfeiting team will be ineligible to apply for or receive any pool players from the following year's player pool relating to the same division in which the forfeit took place.	
	NOTE: Forfeits for any reason in the final series negates the forfeiting team's rights to participate further in the tournament.	
Item 8	Determining Positions for Finals	
	Positions for the Final Series will be determined as follows: 1. Highest competition points – if equal 2. Difference (for and against) – if equal 3. Percentages – if equal 4. Result of Round game – if draw 5. Drop off	
	FORFEIT AFFECTED POSITIONS If two or more teams finish level on competition points and any of those teams were involved in a forfeited match in the round games, the forfeit may cause some obvious problems. When a non-offending team has been involved in a forfeit, the 'for and against' from that forfeit will not count in the final calculations.	
	Similarly, for the other teams that finish on equal points, they will have the 'for and against' from that forfeited team deducted from their total. For teams involved competing against teams on two occasions during the tournament, the calculations for the benefit of this rule will be the corresponding game in each round. For example:	
	Team C forfeits to Team A in game three (first round)	
	Team A wins 5 – 0 on forfeit. Team B defeats Team C 5 – 3 in game four (first round)	
	If after the round games, the 'for and against' is:	
	Team A -50 for and 10 against (plus 40)Team B -60 for and 20 against (plus 40)	
	The above results would be deducted first, and the result is:	
	Team A -45 for and 10 against (plus 35)Team B -55 for and 17 against (plus 38)	
	Therefore, Team B would gain the higher position	
	For the purpose of keeping records, if a forfeit occurs, the non-offending team will be awarded a 5 – 0 win and three competition points. The offending team will receive zero competition points and will receive a score of 0 – 5 against their record.	
	This section only deals with forfeited affected positions for non-offending teams. The offending team that causes the forfeit will have their calculations treated as normal as they have been penalised by not gaining any competition points for the match they forfeited.	
	DIFFERENCES	
	The difference is determined by subtracting the total number of trys scored 'against' from the number of try's scored 'for'. The team with the best difference will obtain the high position. For example:	
	Team A scores 50 for and 10 against Team B scores 40 for and 10 against	
	By subtracting the 'against' from the 'for', Team A would be 'plus 40', whilst Team B would be 'plus 30'. Team A would therefore obtain the higher position.	
	If teams have the same 'difference' the percentage system would then apply.	
	PERCENTAGES	
	If this system is used, it is easily explained that the 'difference' is in the 'plus' situation (see above), the team with the least amount of trys scored against them, would obtain the higher position. However, if the	

	'difference' is in the 'minus' situation, the team that has scored the most trys (for) would obtain the high position.
	The percentage system is calculated by placing try's 'for' over try's 'against' and multiplying by 100 over 1.

	In the above example Team A would obtain the higher percentage
	RESULT OF ROUNDS If all is equal, then the results of the preliminary game between the two will determine the higher position.
	DROP-OFF If the result of the round game was a draw, a drop-off will occur with details to be communicated by Tournament Management.
ltem 9	Complaints and Protests
	TFWA recognise that all parties wish to have the opportunity, should a situation arise, to have their position heard and/or considered.
	A 'complaint' may be dealt with informally or formally through the lodgement of an Official Protest.
	Tournament Management aims to provide a simple dispute resolution process for complaints based on the principles of procedural fairness. Any person (a complainant) may report a complaint about a person/s, and/or organisation.
	Tournament Management will ensure a fair hearing/consideration occurs at various levels in a fair and reasonable manner. However, TFWA also requires that as the primary purpose is to seek an outcome/resolve an issue, all in attendance at a judiciary is to work on that basis and the primary purpose of all in attendance is to work within the framework stipulated. The aim to deal with the complaint or incident at the lowest level at which a matter can be dealt with shall always be preferred.
	TFWA reminds all parties that the following issues will not be open to protest and therefore formally advises all teams that they must be aware of, and comply with this requirement, prior to the commencement of games:
	• The Referee – The referee is the sole judge on matters of fact and is required to adjudicate on the rules of the game during play. The referee may impose any sanction necessary to control the match and in particular award penalties for infringements against the rules, at his/her discretion and interpretation
	<ul> <li>Authority of the Referee – Players, coaches and officials of both teams are under the control of the officiating referee, during the conduct of a game/match.</li> </ul>
	Any protest put to Tournament Management on the above issues will be dismissed without the right of appeal.
	Tournament Management does request that any matter associated with the above may be brought to the attention of Tournament Referee Management so that direct discussions can occur with the TFWA Referee Panel and subsequently the referee, as required.
	All other complaints will be dealt with promptly, seriously, sensitively and confidentially, as per the outline above.
	If you wish to remain 'Anonymous' in the lodgement of any complaint or issue, Tournament Management may have difficulty assisting you to resolve your complaint. Procedural fairness means that Tournament Management is required to provide the person/people you have complained about with full disclosure of details pertinent to the complaint and the complainant, so they have a fair opportunity to respond.
Item 10	Informal Complaint/Resolution Process
	Step 1: Talk with the other person (where this is reasonable, safe, and appropriate)

	Step 3: Resolution
	Tournament Management will document the complaint or protest, the process and the outcome. The Affiliate Contact or their nominated representative will be notified of the decision. Any notice to be served on any person to attend a hearing will be served on the Affiliate Contact or their nominated representative. Any such service is deemed to be served on all parties or persons within that State Championship Entity.
	The documents will be stored in an event-based folder that will allow for future reference if required. If the protest is upheld, then the bond will be returned. If the protest is dismissed, the bond may not be returned and would be retained by the event.
	Step 4: Reconsideration of initial outcome or subsequent appeal
	If, under this process you are not satisfied, you may request that Tournament Management reconsider the complaint or protest through the appeal process. The grounds and process for appeals then moves to the First Level Appeal Process, explained within the TFA Disciplinary Regulations.
Item 12	Disciplinary Regulations
	TFA have implemented Disciplinary Regulations and have expressly withdrawn the A Ready Reference Guide to Judiciary Matters.
	Touch Football Australia is the 'TFA Authority' and when using the Disciplinary Regulations commences at the Disciplinary Tribunal level and allows for a first level appeal to occur in an event environment. This is therefore the final level of an appeal that will be used within the event environment.
	A second level appeal process is available, however cannot be implemented inside an event environment. Second level appeals will be undertaken separately to an event under normal Disciplinary Regulations timelines and processes (see Points 7-18 below).
	In all cases the Disciplinary Regulations apply to this event, with amendments to the timelines (annotated in Bold) to ensure the urgency in dealing with situations that arise in an event context as outlined below:
	7. CONVENING DISCIPLINARY TRIBUNAL HEARINGS
	(b) Notification of persons charged under these Disciplinary Regulations must include details of the day, time and place of the Disciplinary Tribunal hearing at which the charge will be heard in accordance with these Disciplinary Regulations, and must be provided at least one hours' notice to such hearing.

If the score sheet has not been signed and the time has passed for a protest to be lodged, the information on the score sheet will be recorded. If the information on the score sheet is unclear, the relevant parties may be contacted to confirm.

	If a team does not agree with the score on the score sheet, they are to lodge a protest via the Affiliate Contact as indicated above.

	Tournament Management will take a common-sense approach to teams who do not purposefully break this rule by failing to complete this administrational requirement. A \$20 (GST exclusive) fine per additional player will be issued to the State Championship Affiliate if this occurs.
	If a team believes that the opposition plays an unregistered player or plays more than 14 players, they are to lodge a protest. For the protest to be upheld, the opposition must agree that they broke this rule or conclusive video evidence must be provided.
ltem 18	Interchange Area Rules
	The interchange areas will be positioned on both sides of the fields, as illustrated in the 8 <sup>th</sup> Edition of the TFA Playing Rules (six a side).
	The team winning or awarded the toss has the right to choose the interchange area on behalf of their team. A maximum of 20 registered participants <b>(including players, coaches, and team managers)</b> may be present on the playing surface (including interchange area and permitted coaching positions). Each individual must wear closed footwear.
	Failure to comply with this will result in individuals being asked to leave the field for the duration of the game and may result in further action. If a team believes that the opposition had more than 20 registered participants in their interchange area, they may lodge a protest. For the protest to be upheld, the opposition must agree that they broke this rule or conclusive video evidence must be provided.
	If the protest is upheld, it cannot change the result of the game however, it may attract significant fines.

Item 25	Talent Identification
	This event will be used for the continuous Talent Identification process for the selection of state squads. It is important for the purposes of selection; any number changes or uniform issues are communicated with Tournament Management.
	It is not necessary for players to nominate for this process; however all players will be assessed unless they inform Touch Football WA that they are not available for selection.
	Selectors will be responsible for the selection of the most valuable player in each division during the Grand Finals.

D	POLICIES
Item 1	Policies
	It is the responsibility of each State Championship Affiliates to ensure that their respective Affiliates behave in the manner as detailed in the:
	All of these documents are available from Touch Football WA, or from the Touch Football WA and TFA websites.
	In addition to the Membership & Participant Declaration Form, which is to be accepted online by all players and officials, the following rules of conduct must be followed:
	Players/Officials will at all times comply with the reasonable and lawful directions, requests and instructions of Touch Football WA and Staff, Affiliate Contacts and Team Management.
	Players/Officials will exhibit exemplary conduct at all times including whilst travelling to and from the tournament.
	Players/Officials causing wilful damage to property will be required to take responsibility for that damage and make appropriate restitution. Such players may also expect to be suspended or dismissed from participating further in the tournament and any future tournaments or teams.
	Players/Officials/Affiliate Spectators are required to demonstrate respect for fellow players, administrators, and officials at all times. Ill-disciplined, poor behaviour or lack of respect for other persons or property may result in the suspension and/or dismissal of the player from the tournament and any future tournaments or teams. Further action may also be taken.
	You are reminded that by law a player under 18 years of age is not permitted under any circumstances to enter a licensed premise or to partake in the consumption of alcohol while at the event, or while travelling to and from the event.
	Any player/official found to have participated in group dares/scavenger hunt that includes the theft or damage to property may result in that player being suspended and/or dismissal of the player from the tournament. Further action may also be taken.
	Any player/official caught participating in a 'nude/streak' run during the time the tournament is being conducted may be suspended from all Touch for a period of up to 12 months from the date of the offence.

	The taking or supplying of any illegal drug will not be tolerated. Any player/official found to be breaking the law by using or supplying illegal drugs will be handed over to the Police for due process.
	Any player/official/spectator that uses offensive language towards other players, officials or administrators may result in that person receiving a suspension and/or dismissal of the person from the tournament. Further action may also be taken.
	Any practice that involves any form of victimisation, financial fines, abuse or physical or sexual harassment will not be tolerated.
	Touch Football WA will coordinate the investigation of any reports of a breach of these codes and policies. If proven, strong action will be taken by Touch Football WA.
Item 2	Member Protection
	Member Protection is a significant issue both within the community and within the sports environment. Touch Football WA has a moral responsibility to ensure we are remaining current with Member Protection issues related to the members of Touch Football WA.
	One initiative that Touch Football WA is currently adopting as an education process on the issue is the 'Play by the Rules' program available at <u>www.playbytherules.net.au</u> . This website has a number of interactive courses that coaches and officials can undertake to learn more about Member Protection. Below is the statement from the home page of the Play by the Rules website.
	Play by the Rules provides information and online learning about how to prevent and deal with discrimination, harassment and child abuse for the sport and recreation industry. Play by the Rules is a partnership between the Australian Sports Commission and all State/Territory sport and recreation and anti-discrimination agencies.
	The information on Play by the Rules is not intended to be, nor should it be relied upon as, a substitute for legal or other professional advice. Play by the Rules is supported by the Australian and State and Territory Governments.
	Touch Football WA will encourage each official attending Touch Football WA events to complete the online course and supply to their State Championships Affiliates a certificate of completing the course. The course is very easy, informative and takes limited time to complete. The printed certificate would be submitted at the Tournament Briefing with the Registration Information.
	The certificate can be supplied and then a register can be maintained for future events, therefore the ongoing requirement would be for new officials each event. We hope that you find value in this initiative as we all work towards providing an environment that is both positive and safe for all participants.
Item 3	Legal Guardianship Issues
	Legal Guardianship is the responsibility of the State Championships Affiliates.
	In some instances, persons under the age of 18 will be in attendance at the event. In understanding our expectations around your role and responsibilities we provide you some additional information related to legal guardianship.
	This communication contains general advice only and does not take into account individual objectives, circumstances and/or a legal view. The information contained in this communication is only to offer some additional information on this particular area and individual research and advice should be sort for your personal circumstance.
	<b>Guardians</b> – A guardianship is a legal right given to a person to be responsible for the food, healthcare, housing, and other necessities of a person deemed fully or partially incapable of providing these necessities for himself or herself.
	What are a Guardian's Duties: The guardian makes decisions about how the person lives including their residence, healthcare, food and social activity. The guardian is intended to monitor the person, to make sure that the person lives in the most appropriate, least restrictive environment possible, with appropriate food, clothing, social opportunities and medical care.

	<b>Communication with the Parents:</b> Ensure you are informed of any medical concerns, including food allergies. In addition, you will need to agree on things like sleeping arrangements, the administration of over-the-counter medications, and procedures for contacting the parents in an emergency.

Item 4	Supervision of Under Age Players
	State Championship Affiliates are to be reminded that they are responsible for the direct supervision of any player or official who is under the age of 18 years. All steps should be taken by the State Championships Affiliate to protect these persons from all forms of harassment. This includes ensuring that:
	<ul> <li>All minors must be made fully aware of the TFA Code of Conduct</li> <li>All officials comply with the relevant Child Protection laws</li> <li>When travelling to, during and from the tournament all care is taken to supervise minors</li> </ul>
ltem 5	Child Protection
	Anyone who will be taking part in the 2023 WA State Touch Football Championships who will be dealing with a 'substantial' number of players who are under the age of 18 years will be required to hold a valid Working with Children's Check. What is deemed to be a 'substantial' number of players will be determined by Touch Football WA in conjunction with the WWC Screening Unit and the Sports Federation. Please note that parents who are coaching/managing their own child's team are exempt from having to hold a Working with Children's Check.
ltem 6	Images and Video Footage
	All persons accept that, by participating in this event, they may be photographed and/or filmed and that these images may be used by Touch Football WA and authorised parties for promotion of the sport. Touch Football WA will not pass any image onto unauthorised third parties unless prior approval is sought. If you do not wish Touch Football WA to be able to use your image or be filmed, you must notify Touch Football WA in writing. With the use of social media, it is now important Touch Football WA through TFA has regulations around the filming of players and games at events. To protect the privacy and images anyone filming games or players will be required to be registered with Tournament Management and have permission to film. In allowing filming they must comply with relevant clauses around the use of footage, these will be provided on the registration sheet.
ltem 7	Weather
	The climate in Perth is susceptible to fluctuating weather patterns. Touch Football WA reserves the right to organise the affected games in whatever format which will assist the games to occur in an equal condition as possible.
	Touch Football WA will use <u>Extreme Weather Guidelines</u> , in the case of Hot Weather, Wet Weather and Storms.
	Match Reschedule:
	If due to any other extraordinary circumstances, a game cannot be completed to full time the game may be rescheduled as soon as possible at a time and on a ground arranged by Tournament Management in consultation with both teams.

Item 9	Blood Bin
	Any player with a bleeding cut or abrasion is to leave the field immediately and have the cut or abrasion cleaned or covered. At this time, any blood-stained clothing must also be either cleaned or replaced. If the player does not leave the field immediately, the referee will stop the game and ask the player to leave the
	field (normal substitution rules apply).
	Once the flow of blood has been stemmed, the cut or abrasion cleaned and covered and any blood-stained clothing and equipment cleaned or replaced, the player may return to the field and continue play. If bleeding cannot be controlled and the wound securely covered, the player must not continue in the game.

Item 10	Glass Bottles and Alcohol (very Important Information)
	All participants are to refrain from bringing glass containers of any type into the venue.
	As per the Liquor Licensing Act, no person is permitted to consume alcohol outside of the designated drinking areas. It is illegal under Liquor Licensing Laws for any person to bring alcohol onto the grounds or consume alcohol other than that purchased from the Licensed Area while at the grounds. Any person found consuming alcohol not purchased at the venue will be kindly asked to leave the venue and will be prevented from participating in the remainder of the event.
	Penalty:
	A fine of \$1,000 (GST exclusive) will apply for each incident. This penalty will be enforced and the offender(s) will be invoiced accordingly. Touch Football WA will require Affiliate Contacts and Team Managers within each State Championships Entity to assist and take control of their members.
