The behaviour of coaches and managers can directly impact those of their players. Coaches and managers should act responsibly and set an example for their team by:

- Reporting all incidences of discrimination, harassment or bullying to club officials.
- Using appropriate language and becoming familiar with appropriate terminology. Eq:
 - » Gender neutral language (they, them)
 - » Avoid using gendered phrases (you throw like a girl)
 - » Learn their preferred pronouns
- Becoming familiar with the club's inclusion/gender diversity policies.
- Respecting the privacy and confidentiality of gender diverse players within your team unless having their consent to do otherwise.
- Never asking someone about their gender identity or sexual orientation
- Being open to speaking with athletes, coaches or other support staff who have questions or express concerns.
- Becoming more familiar with LGBTQ+ issues in sport.
 Knowing what resources are available to assist those who are LGBTQ+ and may be struggling.
- Take advantage of opportunities provided by Touch Football Australia and relevant allied organisations to learn more about gender diversity in sport.

REFEREES & MATCH OFFICIALS







As a referee or match official, you have a responsibility to ensure our game is played in a fair and safe environment for all participants. To protect all players, referees and match officials should:

- Monitor on-field conduct to ensure it stays within the rules.
- Enforce rules fairly, regardless of players gender identity.
- Monitor poor on-field behaviour e.g., Intentional misgendering or excessive contact.
- Listen and respond to complaints.
- Never ask someone about their gender identity or sexual orientation.
- Don't assume player's gender or pronouns. Instead, use gender neutral terms such as they, them.
- Take advantage of opportunities provided by Touch Football Australia and relevant allied organisations to learn more about gender diversity in sport.
- Familiarise yourself with the policies and frameworks outlined by local affiliates and Touch Football Australia.
- Respect the privacy and confidentiality of players gender identity unless you have permission to do otherwise.

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Club or team culture is directly affected by the behaviours and attitudes of players and teammates. To ensure you are fostering an inclusive team environment, all players and teammates should:

- Play within the rules regardless of your opposition.
- Familiarise yourself with your club's inclusion/gender diversity policies.
- Include gender diverse teammates in social and teambuilding activities.
- Not tolerate discrimination, harassment or bullying of any sort. If you experience behaviours like this, immediately report it to coaches or club/match officials.
- Respect privacy and confidentiality of other players gender identity unless you have their permission to do otherwise.
- Never ask someone about their gender identity or sexual orientation.
- Don't assume someone's gender or pronouns. If you are unsure, ask politely.
- Take advantage of opportunities provided by Touch Football Australia and relevant allied organisations to learn more about gender diversity in sport.

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Clubs and organisations set the foundation for a supportive and inclusive sporting environment. To continue to grow and develop our sport, clubs and organisations should:

- Policies
 - Ensure policies and procedures are up to date and inclusive of transgender and gender diverse people.
 - » Take active steps to ensure all are educated on and aware of the policies, including players, managers, coaches and officials.
- · Code of Conduct
 - » Implement a zero-tolerance policy.
 - » Commit to a harassment free environment and an inclusive culture.
- Inclusive Language
 - » Do not make assumptions about someone's sex, sexuality or gender based on their appearance for pre-existing societal expectations.
 - » Become familiar with respectful language and appropriate terminology.
- Uniforms
 - » Provide appropriate uniforms and allow participants to choose their own uniform from a variety of variations.
 - » Ensure uniforms are appropriately sized and suited for all frames.
- Facilities
 - » Change facility signage e.g., all-gender bathrooms where possible.
 - » Ensure facilitates have proper waste disposal.
- Participation
 - » Provide mixed or gender-neutral teams where possible.

In Touch Football, we are always striving to provide a 'place on the field for everyone', a sport that 'everyone can play', but we can't just say that without action – we need to provide meaningful guidelines and resources for those who deliver and participate in our sport so we can create Touch communities that are genuinely safe and inclusive
