INTRODUCTION

The Cold Climate Classic has a whole new look for 2024 with a change of venue and date and some exciting additions to the original format. Hosted by Touch Football Tasmania and the Launceston Touch Association, the event will be run as a Club Championship for Tasmanian Clubs in the Open Men's', Women's' and Mixed Divisions with an invitation to all clubs and teams across Australia to participate. For the first time in Tasmania a Fast-4s tournament will also be incorporated into the Cold Climate Classic to add another element of fun and fast-flowing action into the tournament. As always, the aim of the event is to create an exciting weekend of Touch Football whilst extending your stay to enjoy some of the wonderful experiences in and around Launceston. (Refer to the three exciting Package Deals that we have included in our Registration Process).

November in Launceston is a truly beautiful time of the year, and we extend an invitation to all of our Touch Football family to come and join us in the 2024 Cold Climate Classic across the weekend of November 16 & 17, 2024.



A – ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

Item 1 Tournament Venue and Dates

The venue will be: **Churchill Park, Launceston**

The date of competition will be **16th-17th November**

PLEASE NOTE: The Fast-4's will be played in an exclusive timeslot when no other games are being played. This will most-likely be on Saturday afternoon (November 16, from approximately 2pm-5pm tbc). This will enable all players to be available to try this exciting format and compete for the Fast-4s championship!!

Item 2 Team Eligibility

Item 2.1 – For Open Men, Women & Mixed Divisions: (Cold Climate Classic / Club Championships)

- Teams representing any current affiliate-registered clubs or small affiliates in Tasmania:
- Any invitational teams and/or teams representing any Touch Football Australia affiliate, as approved by TFT.
- Additional teams must be endorsed by their respective Affiliate and/or TFT.
- Any existing or casual team may register to participate in this event. Teams must have a minimum of 10 players to be viable.
- Each Team must meet the required placement numbers: minimum 10, maximum 14 per game, maximum squad 16.

Item 2.2 – For Fast-4's Division:

- Any invitational, casual, existing or club team may register to participate in this event.
- Non TFA members or non TFA affiliated clubs are eligible to participate.
- Teams must have a minimum of 6 players, maximum of 8 players
- Teams are mixed, with a minimum age of 14 (in 2024 calendar year)
- Teams must have a minimum of 2 female players on the field at any one time

All participants of the event must be full financial members of TFA and financial by **Friday November 6, 2024** and abide by the laws and by-laws of TFT & TFA. This includes players and officials (both team and referees), their current Affiliate, Region and/or State. For non-affiliated Fast 4 teams and individuals this means paying the individual competition fee.

Item 3 Tournament Fees

Individual fees for the tournament are:

- \$25 per person for the fast 4s tournament only
- \$60 per person for the Cold Climate Championship (Men's, Women's or Mixed Divisions) only.
- \$70 per person for players who participate in both the Cold Climate Classic and Fast 4s Tournament.

- \$80 per person to participate in 2 separate opens divisions.
- \$90 per person to participate in 2 separate opens divisions plus Fast 4s
- All fees are inclusive of GST.

Item 3.1 Add on Experiences

Individuals can select two optional add-on tourism experiences when registering. These tours are coordinated by a third party (Luxury Golf and Scenic Tours).

To book an optional add on experience select from the drop-down menu when registering and select the desired price option and pay with your tournament fees. Then complete the online booking form on the Cold Climate Classic website <https://touchfootball.com.au/cold-climate-classic/> . **Note – the booking form must be completed to secure your booking.**

Prices are

- West Tamar Valley Luxury Wine Tour - \$170pp + tournament fee
- Barnbougle Golf Experience - \$350pp + tournament fee

Item 4 Player Eligibility

All participating members must be financial with TFA prior to participating

Participants who are not financial will be known as 'un-financial' and as such will be unregistered participants. If any team plays with an 'un-financial' member the team will forfeit that round. If a team plays with an 'un-financial' member for a second time the team will be disqualified.

It is the responsibility of each team being represented to ensure that all their players and officials are registered and financial.

Players in the CCC and Fast-4's must be registered through MySideline to participate. Players who are marked within the system as un-financial will not be able to register.

Item 5 Player Pool – Cold Climate Classic Only

A player pool will operate for the Cold Climate Classic competition, managed by TFT. Any player who does not play for one of the listed clubs who wishes to participate can nominate for the player pool. Pool players will be allocated to teams based on their registrations and the competition's need. Pool player allocations will be conducted on **November 8, 2024**.

If pool player nominations allow, TFT may at their discretion enter a team composed of pool players.

Item 6 Divisions



Division	Age Restriction
CCC Open Men's	No Restriction
CCC Open Women's	No Restriction
CCC Open Mixed	No restriction
Fast-4's Mixed	Turned 14 or over in 2024 calendar year
Fast-4s Mixed	Under 15s
Fast-4s Mixed	Under 18s

Only male players may nominate for male divisions. Only female players may nominate for female divisions.

Players can register in multiple divisions of the CCC. (Example, Can play in both men's and mixed but not men's and women's)

Participants CAN play in both the Fast-4's and any of the CCC Divisions (this is highly encouraged!)

The Fast-4's will be played in an exclusive timeslot when no other games are being played. This will most-likely be on Saturday afternoon, November 16, from approximately 2pm-5pm tbc. This will enable all players to be available to try this exciting format and compete for the Fast-4s championship!!

NOTE: Should there be insufficient teams to conduct a division, TFT may decide to include a team in an alternate, suitable division, in consultation with the teams involved.

Item 7 Coach Eligibility

A coach and/or team delegate from each Cold Climate Classic team will need to provide a copy of their Coach Accreditation (minimum Foundation Coach) to TFA prior to 11 October (when final Team Nominations are due)

Item 8 Team Nomination Process

Teams must submit their Team Nomination via the online registration process by Monday 6 November 2024.

Item 9 Individual Registration Process

It is the responsibility of each team participating to ensure all of their players and officials are registered to play.

To complete your individual registration go to www.touchfootball.com.au, click the box marked “Register”, then click “Player” (or “official”) then search for Tasmania or Cold Climate Classic. Individuals select their team (or player pool) and complete the registration and payment process.

Participants must be registered by **5pm AEDT – Friday 13 November 2024**

Pool players will be allocated to a team by TFA after individual registrations close, and team delegates will be notified asap

Item 10 Medical Assistance

Cold Climate Classic teams are required to supply their own medical staff for the treatment of minor injuries.

TFT will provide the services of a Sports Trainer who shall be available at the fields for emergency treatment of minor injuries.

Item 11 Referees

Referees must complete their online registration by: **5pm Friday 8 November, 2024**

Referees are required to carry a minimum Level 1 Badge accreditation and must be active referees at affiliate level.

Item 12 Player and Officials' Behaviour

In accordance with the Rules of the Game players and officials are reminded to demonstrate respect toward referees, opponents and tournament officials. Instances of disrespect by players or officials during a game will be dealt with as advised by the Rules of the Game. Players who continue to overtly display disrespectful or unsportsmanlike behaviour, whether playing or not, will be liable to sanction by Tournament Control. Players and officials may be referred directly to the Judiciary by Tournament Control staff at any time for unsportsmanlike conduct and be liable to suspension.

Players and officials are not to engage with referees directly following a game, other than to sign the scorecard and offer thanks. If any team has a grievance with a referee they are to wait a minimum 30 minutes following the game and submit a referee grievance to Tournament Control. If necessary, a Judiciary hearing may be convened to discuss the grievance and issue appropriate sanction and/or guidance to Tournament Control.

Item 13 Insurance

The TFA Accident Insurance Scheme covers all players and officials who have met the insurance criteria of a TFA affiliated competition. For this event all registered participants are covered under this scheme.

Item 14 Late Entries

Team Nomination Forms received after the relevant closing date will only be accepted at the discretion of the Tournament Director and may incur a late payment of half the Tournament levy.



Item 15 Refunds

No refunds will be provided to any team or participant that withdraws after the close of nominations. A full refund will apply to teams that are not able to play due to insufficient number of teams nominating to stage a division which will be determined after the close of nominations.

Item 16 Tents and Associated Equipment

Any teams who are arranging tents or shelters must notify Kim.Williams@touchfootball.com.au no later than Friday 25th October, 2024

Item 17 Uniforms

All Cold Climate Classic playing uniforms must include:

- a numbered
- a 1 or 2 digit number which meets the requirements of the TFA rules of the game. No temporary measures such as tape will be permitted to replace numbers;
- no three digit numbers will be permitted;
- shorts or bike pants;

To assist with crowd control, team officials must also wear Affiliate or team clothing while they are involved in any game and ensure they wear enclosed footwear (i.e. if they are in the interchange area or in an alternative coaching position).

A combination of playing uniforms is not permitted within a specific team. All members of the team must wear the same style, cut and design of shirt, singlet top, shorts, bike pants,

Any player who is not playing in the official uniform will not be allowed to take the field of play until correctly attired. Referees will endeavour to enforce this rule, however if a breach is proven to have occurred it will result in a caution and fine as deemed appropriate by Tournament Control.

B – EVENT SPECIFIC INFORMATION

Item 1 Rules – Men's, Women's and Mixed Divisions:

The 8th edition of the TFA Playing Rules will apply. Rules can be viewed on the TFA website.

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All round games in the Cold Climate Classic/Club Championship Divisions will be played for 2 x 20 minute halves, with no extra time. Semi-Finals and Finals (as required) will be played to achieve a result, with a period of drop-off as detailed in the TFA Playing Rules if regular time expires with the scores tied.

Item 1.1 – Fast-4's Rules:

All games in the Fast-4's will be 2 x 7 min halves with a 1-min half-time break.

There must be a minimum of 2 Female Players on-field at all times.

There will be 4 touches per team before a change of possession.

Semi-finals and Finals will be played to achieve a result, with a Golden Point system in place. First points scored in Golden Point extra-time wins the game. (A coin-toss will be used to decide who has possession to start extra-time).

Item 2 Tournament Control

Kim Williams (TFT State Manager) will be the Tournament Director. Ryan Shipp (TFT Community Sports Coordinator) will be the Assistant Tournament Director. Other staff will be provided from TFA and from the host Launceston Touch Association as ground control staff.

TFA will determine and/or interpret matters not covered by the Conditions of Entry and TFA decisions will be final. TFA has the right to amend any tournament rule if required.

Tournament Control has several recognised processes available to support the overall management and conduct of the event. These processes may include informal and formal, and it is the discretion of Tournament Control which avenues are used to eliminate issues or caution participants.

Item 3 Draw Formula

After the close of team nominations, an indicative draw will be distributed.

A pool system will be employed for this event, with the structure to be determined by Tournament Control to best suit the majority of participants. Teams will play a minimum of 4 games over the event.

All finals games must result in an outright winner. In the event of a drawn match at the end of full-time, a drop-off will determine the match winner.

Item 4 Match Balls

All teams must use the official Match Ball in all games throughout the tournament. Each team shall receive a ball from TFT prior to the start of the tournament.

Item 5 Competition Points

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For all games, competition points will be awarded on the results obtained.

The following points will be awarded:

Win	=	Three (3) points
Draw	=	Two (2) points
Loss	=	One (1) point
Forfeit	=	Zero (0) points for the offending team – Three (3) points for non-offending team
Bye	=	Zero (0) points – so long as there are equal number of byes allocated within the pool

Item 6 Presentations and Prize Money

Winning teams in each division of the Cold Climate Classic and Fast 4-s will receive Winning Team Medallions which will be presented to the teams at the conclusion of all Grand-Final matches.

Each Division will also have prize money attached (subject to minimum requirement of entries received).

Men's, Women's Mixed Open's Divisions and Fast-4's.

Overall winners: \$750 each Division

Runners-Up: \$250 each Division

Item 7 Forfeits

Teams must be in attendance at their playing fields five minutes before the commencement of their match or advertised time.

It is the responsibility of each captain to report to the referees two minutes before the commencement of the game or advertised time, so that the toss of the coin can be affected without loss of time.

If a team is not at the field at the appropriate time, the attending team can be awarded the winning of the toss.

The offending team will receive a maximum of five minutes from the commencement of the game (siren/whistle) to position the team on the field and be ready to commence play. The offending team will be penalised one touchdown after the first minute and one touchdown for every minute thereafter up to five minutes.

If the offending team is not in attendance after the five minutes has expired, the game will be deemed a forfeit and the non-offending team will be awarded a 5 - 0 win and three competition points. The offending team will receive a score of 0 - 5 and no competition points.



The Team Delegate or their appointed representative of an offending team will be required to give reasons in writing why their team should not be excluded from participating in any further matches. Tournament Control or an appointed Judiciary will decide upon receipt of the report if the offending teams' action warranted the need to forfeit the match.

Item 8 Determining positions for Finals

Finals

Positions for the final series will be determined, in order, as follows:

1. Highest on table - if equal
2. Difference (for and against) - if equal
3. Touchdowns for (ie better attack) - if equal
4. Result of Round game - if draw
5. Drop off

Differences

The difference is determined by subtracting the total of touchdowns scored 'against' from the number of touchdowns scored 'for'. The team with the best difference will obtain the higher position. For example:

Team A scores 50 for and 10 against
Team B scores 40 for and 10 against

By subtracting the 'against' from the 'for', Team A would be 'plus 40', whilst Team B would be 'plus 30'. Team A would therefore obtain the higher position.

If teams have the same 'difference' then whichever team has scored more touchdowns overall will progress.

Result of Rounds

If all is equal, then the result of the preliminary game between the two shall determine the higher position.

Drop-off

If the result of the round game was a draw (or even in the case of more than one game), a drop-off will occur with details to be communicated by Tournament Control, but to be completed as soon as possible after the last preliminary game has been completed.

Item 9 Escalation Process



It is the intention of TFA to provide a high level event which is conducted within the framework communicated and agreed by all parties in the current Competition Guidelines and 8th Edition Playing Rules.

As an organisation we recognise that all parties wish to have the opportunity, should a situation arise, to have their position heard and/or considered. TFA will ensure this occurs at various levels however also states that the primary purpose of all in attendance is to work within the framework stipulated.

The Judiciary or appeal process if required will be chaired by a TFA Official, or their appointed delegate.

TFA reminds all parties that the following issues will not be open to appeal and/or protest and therefore formally advises all teams that they must be aware of this prior to the commencement of games:

- 25.1 The Referee is the sole judge on all match related matters inside the Perimeter for the Duration of a match, has jurisdiction over all players, coaches and officials

Any protest put to Tournament Control on the above issues will be dismissed without the right of appeal.

Tournament Control will explain the process at the time and discuss any requirements with the party lodging such documentation.

TFA does request however that any matter associated with Rule 25.1 may be brought to the attention of Tournament Control so that direct discussions can occur with the Tournament Referee Director and subsequently the referee if required. Any affiliate or team official who chooses to take this approach is required to wait until 30 minutes after the completion of the game being discussed.

Tournament Control will always endeavour to mediate disputes with parties in a way that encourages understanding of the decision-making process and encourages participation.

Item 10 Protests or Appeals

Protests or appeals must be lodged in writing within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the event or game in question, to an official in the Information Area. The protest is to be lodged and signed by the Team Manager or their nominated representative.

Upon receipt of a protest or appeal, Tournament Control shall determine if a hearing is necessary. Tournament Control advises that in instances where the conditions are not clear or a matter may require specific clarification or appeal to matters of dispensation or concession then Tournament Control may make an initial ruling. If the matter is further appealed then a hearing of the TFA will result to ensure independent assessment by the party in place to review the event requirements.



Appeals founded or based on decisions of referees will not be heard by Tournament Control. An overall briefing on tournament conditions and rules will be conducted with attending referees.

The Judiciary Chair will then investigate the protest. The team delegate will be notified of the decision. Any notice to be served on any person to attend a hearing will be served on the team delegate. Any such service is deemed to be served on all parties or persons within that Entity.

Item 11 Judiciary

Reports or citing must be lodged in writing within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the event or game under scrutiny, to an official in the Information Area.

Upon receipt of a Referees Report or Citing Report, Tournament Control shall determine if a hearing is necessary.

If a hearing is deemed to be necessary, Tournament Control will then serve notice on all parties required to attend a hearing, which will be conducted as soon as is practical.

A Judiciary Committee will be appointed by Tournament Control, which will then carry out a hearing in accordance with TFA policy.

Item 12 Suspensions

In the event of a player being sent from the field for the remainder of the game, an automatic two match suspension will apply unless the Judiciary Committee considers other action is warranted.

Any player who is sent from the field for a period of time (Sin Bin) three times during the tournament will be required to appear before the Judiciary Committee to show cause why he/she should not be given an automatic two match suspension (or more if the Judiciary considers further action is warranted).

The suspension applies to the next two matches the team participates in the event or future events. It does not include byes, or if the player belongs to a team that forfeits in a match. Games forfeited to the suspended player's team will count.

In the event that a suspension or penalty is imposed that may affect a local or state event, there needs to be communication with the relevant state office.

Item 13 Score Sheets



It is the responsibility of each team to allocate the appropriate person (Team Manager, Captain or Coach) to sign the score sheet at the end of each game. In signing the score sheet the nominated person on behalf of their team has acknowledged and accepted the information on the score sheet to be correct. This information includes:

- Full-time and half-time scores
- Playing Numbers
- Touchdown scorers
- Send Offs or Period of Times

If a team does not agree with the information on the score sheet, they are not to sign the score sheet and lodge a protest via the Team Delegate as indicated above.

If the score sheet has not been signed and the time has passed for a protest to be lodged, the information on the score sheet will be recorded.

If the information on the score sheet is unclear, the relevant parties may be contacted to confirm.

Item 14 Score Disputes

If a team does not agree with the score on the score sheet, they are to lodge a protest via the Team Delegate as indicated above.

The following information is to be provided with the protest:

- Who tapped off
- The order the scoring occurred (including player numbers of both teams)
- The half-time and full-time score

The opposing team will be called to verify the score. If they do not agree, or in the event of inconclusive evidence, the score will be recorded as the score that the referees have recorded. Alternatively, video evidence can be provided, and the evidence will be used if conclusive.

Item 15 Interchange Area Rules

The interchange areas will be positioned on both sides of the fields, as illustrated in the 8th Edition of the TFA Playing Rules.

The team winning or awarded the toss has the right to choose the interchange area on behalf of their team.

A maximum of 17 registered participants (or 9 for Fast-4's) may be present on the playing surface (including interchange area and permitted coaching positions). Each participant must wear enclosed footwear.



Failure to comply with this will result in individuals being asked to leave the venue for the duration of the game and may result in further action.

If a team believes that the opposition had more than maximum registered participants on the playing surface or unregistered participants in their interchange area they may lodge a protest. For the protest to be upheld, the opposition must agree that they broke this rule or conclusive video/photographic evidence must be provided.

If the protest is upheld, it cannot change the result of the game. However it may attract significant fines.

Item 16 Coaching Positions

A coach may position themselves at the end of a field. If they are at the end of the field they must remain five metres behind the dead ball line. Where a fence or advertising signage prevents this they must remain behind the fence or advertising signage.

Any coaching/management staff at the end of a playing field cannot issue any verbal or physical commands directly to the team they are observing and can only communicate to the team or other coaching/management staff in the interchange area by returning to the interchange area, or by use of electronic communication equipment.

Any person found to be disregarding this tournament rule will be asked to return to the interchange area.

Coaches are reminded that they are under the jurisdiction of the referee regardless of being either in the interchange area or at the end of the field.

Failure to comply with this will result in individuals being asked to leave the venue for the duration of the game and may result in further action.

Item 17 Spectators

The area in between playing fields is only accessible to registered players or officials participating in the relevant time slot. There is **no spectator access** to the area unless otherwise communicated by TFA, or where seating is provided.

To assist in the control of spectators and safety of participants, team delegates are asked to help tournament officials with the policing of this request. Please inform all of your participating members to cooperate with tournament officials by remaining in the designated spectator areas.

Item 18 Communication with Referees

During a match, only the team captain can communicate with a referee.



After the conclusion of a match, the Team Manager or Coach can approach the referees to sign the score sheet but are not to engage in 'heated' discussion.

A meeting may be established to discuss any issues arising during the game via a request through Tournament Control after a 30 minute 'cool off' period has passed.

Those permitted to attend the meeting include:

- Coach
- Designated Team Delegate
- TFT Tournament Control (or designated staff member)
- Match Referee(s)
- Referee Panel Member(s)

C – POLICIES

Item 1 TFA Policies

It is the responsibility of each team to ensure that their respective participating parties behave in the manner as detailed in the:

- TFA Constitution and By Laws
- 2024 TFA Cold Climate Classic Competition Guidelines
- TFA Disciplinary Regulations
- TFA Code of Conduct
- TFA Member Protection Policy
- TFA Child Protection Requirements/Tasmanian Working With Vulnerable People Regulations
- TFA Anti-Doping Policy
- TFA Responsibility Code

All of these documents are available from the TFA website.

Item 2 Weather

TFA reserves the right to organise the affected games in whatever format which will assist the games to occur in as equal conditions as possible. TFA reminds participants that this event is being held in a colder climate than many players may be used to, and that cold/wet weather brings its own challenges to the sport.

Hot Weather



Games will not commence if the temperature exceeds 38 degrees, games will be postponed until such time that the temperature decreases.

If the temperature reaches 35 degrees, any games underway will be completed and any subsequent games will be played as 4 x 10 minute quarters with a two minute break between the first and second, and third and fourth quarters, and a five minute break at half time.

TFA will return to the regular format, guided by a drop in temperature back below 35 degrees.

Wet Weather

TFA reserves the right to organise the affected games in whatever format which will assist the games to occur in as equal conditions as possible.

When wet weather or hot weather affects a finals series, where games need to be cancelled, the top team in each pool will be awarded joint champions

Match Reschedule

If, due to any other extraordinary circumstances, a game cannot be completed to full time the game may be rescheduled as soon as possible at a time and on a ground arranged by Tournament Control in consultation with both teams.

If the game has commenced, and cannot continue prior to half time the following will apply:

- 1) The game will start from the beginning and must be completed up to the regulation full time.
- 2) The score will commence at 0-0.

If half-time has occurred and the game cannot continue, the following will apply:

- 1) The game will start from the beginning of the second half and must be completed up to the regulation full-time.
- 2) The score will commence at the score that was recorded at half-time.

If a team refuses to complete the game when it has been resumed, that team shall forfeit the game.

If, due to time constraints or any other reason, a game cannot be rescheduled the following will occur:

- 1) Games that did not continue prior to half-time will be abandoned and a 0-0 score will result.
- 2) The result of games that did not continue after and including half-time will be the score at that point in time.

Note: Tournament Control reserves the right to judge and adjust to suit the conditions as required.

Item 3 Concussion Policy

The TFA approved Concussion in Sport Policy is as follows:



Grade	First Concussion	Second Concussion	Third Concussion
1. Mild	May return to play if asymptomatic	Return to play in two weeks if asymptomatic at that time for one week.	Terminate season. May return to play if asymptomatic
2. Moderate	Return to play after asymptomatic for one week	Minimum of one month rest. May return to play then if asymptomatic for one week. Consider terminating season	Terminate season. May return to play next season if asymptomatic
3. Severe	Minimum of one month rest. May return if has been asymptomatic for one week	Terminate season. May return to play next season if asymptomatic	Nb. Asymptomatic is defined as having no dizziness, impaired orientation, concentration or memory during rest or exercise.

Item 4 Blood Bin

Any player with a bleeding cut or abrasion is to leave the field immediately and have the cut or abrasion cleaned and covered. At this time, any blood stained clothing must also be either cleaned or replaced. If the player does not leave the field immediately, the referee will stop the game and ask the player to leave the field (normal substitution rules apply).

Once the flow of blood has been stemmed, the cut or abrasion cleaned and covered and any blood stained clothing and equipment cleaned or replaced, the player may return to the field and continue play. If bleeding cannot be controlled and the wound securely covered, the player must not continue in the game.

Item 4 Glass Bottles and Alcohol

Alcohol consumption will be limited to areas covered by the license. Individuals modelling inappropriate alcohol behaviour will be asked to leave.

All participants are to refrain from bringing glass containers of any type into the venue.

Item 5 Parking Areas and Traffic Management

TFA will communicate all traffic management information as required. Any individual parking in an incorrect location will be towed.

Item 6 Force Majeure



1) If TFA is unable to perform, in whole or part in any obligation under these regulations of a Force Majeure Event, TFA is relieved of that obligation under these regulations to the extent, and the period it is unable to perform.

2) In addition to regulation above, TFA has no obligation to refund to any individual or team any fees paid if it is unable to perform by reason of a Force Majeure Event.

FORCE MAJEURE EVENT: for the purposes of these regulations a force majeure event includes but is not limited to any or all of the following:

- Acts of God including flood, drought, earthquake, storm, cyclone, fire, explosion, epidemic; or
- War; or
- Terrorism; or
- Riot or civil disturbances; or
- Permanent injunction of any duly constituted court of competent jurisdiction; or
- Any fact, circumstance, matter or thing beyond the reasonable control of TFA.
