Item 1 – Tournament Venue and Dates

The 2024 NRL Touch Football Capital Territory Cup will be played at Deakin Touch Football fields on Saturday 30th November to Sunday 1st December 2024

Draws will be released online via TFACT website once entity nominations and divisions are finalised.

Item 2 - Entry Fees & Registration

\$40.00 per player – U10 Divisions \$50.00 per player – U12 to U18 Divisions

All players must register via individual registration through My Sideline.

All players must be registered to their appropriate teams prior to competition proper commencing.

Athlete registrations completed after 11th November will incur the \$20.00 p.p. late fee.

Referee nomination must be completed through the supplied online portal for team nominations to be accepted and final.

Item 3 – Team Eligibility

Teams eligible to participate in the 2024 Capital Territory Cup:

- Teams representing approved TFA State and Territory entities.
- Teams representing QTF and NSWTA affiliate entities.
- Teams representing TFA approved affiliates.

Item 4 – Player Eligibility

All players competing at the Capital Territory Cup must be financial members of TFA and/or their respective Affiliate body, with no outstanding debts.

All players must be a registered player in a team within the Affiliate, Region or State that the player wishes to participate in.



Item 5 - Divisions

The 2024 ACT Capital Territory Cup will encompass the following Boys and Girls divisions:

- U10 Born 2015 to 2019
- U12 Born 2013 to 2017
- U14 Born 2011 to 2015
- U16 Born 2009 to 2013
- U18 Born 2007 to 2001

The above-named divisions align with 2025 NSW JSC.

Team numbers will be capped at no more than 14 teams in the first instance in each division. TFACT reserves the right to close divisions at any time that it deems to be at capacity.

A minimum of 5 teams are to be nominated for any division to be seen as viable.

Entities are limited to two (2) teams per division. If divisions reach 14 teams, entities may be limited to one team only.

In instances where teams are equal on competition points at the conclusion of round games, places will be determined by the use of differential in the form of points for and against.

Semi Finals will be contested by those teams who finish 1-4 in their respective divisions. First try scored in Semi Finals is 2 points, each thereafter 1 point.

Where needed Drop off will be used in Grand Finals to determine a winner.

Item 6 - Coach Eligibility

All head coaches and assistant coaches must have a minimum of Foundation Coaching accreditation.

TFACT reserves the right to check any/all coaching accreditations against the national register.

All Coaches must hold a valid WWVP of equivalent.

Item 7 – Registration Process

Players are required to be registered to teams prior to the commencement of competition.

Players are required to register online via My Sideline.

Registration Links will be sent to competing entities.

Player and Referee Registrations must be completed online prior to 1700 AEDT Monday 11th November 2024.

TFACT reserves the right to refuse the nomination of any team that the administration deems fit to do so.

Teams may register a maximum of sixteen (16) players. Only fourteen can participate in each game.



Item 8 - Late Entries

Team nominations received after the closing date may be accepted solely at the discretion of TFACT.

Late fees may apply to any entry accepted after closing date listed.

Item 9 - Referees and Officials

TFACT requests that competing entities supply all Referees and Officials for the ACT Capital Territory Cup.

Referee nominations are to be completed online via the supplied portal for team nominations to be seen as complete.

Each entity entered in CTC is to nominate and supply a referee per team and one extra per entity for the tournament. Failure to supply referees may result in a fee of \$200.00 per referee to the entity.

Example:

Entity A enters 6 teams. Entity A must supply 7 referees.

The nominated referee will be allocated games by the tournament referee coordinator.

All referees must be 14 years or older to be nominated for the competition.

Referees aligned with U14 and U16 teams must hold a Level 2 accreditation at minimum and U18 a Level 3 accreditation minimum.

All Referees and Officials will hold the corresponding accreditation in line with TFA framework.

All referee appointments will be undertaken by the Referee Coordinators. All referees are required to be available for the two days of competition and for finals.

Referees and officials for finals and grand finals will be appointed at the sole discretion of TFACT.

Any renumeration of officials is to be agreed on between officials and the entity they are representing; TFACT accepts no responsibility for the renumeration of officials.

The decision of a Referee and/or Official is deemed to be final.

Any misconduct demonstrated towards a Referee or Official will be dealt with under the TFACT Zero Tolerance Policy and will result in expulsion from the competition remaining competition. Further action may be taken in line with TFA Disciplinary Regulations 2014.



Item 10 - Integrity Education

Touch Football Australia's (TFA) in partnership with Sport Integrity Australia is committed to safeguarding our sport from integrity related threats. In addition to the WADA code, Sport Integrity Australia also manages Safeguarding and Member Protection related matters under the National Integrity Framework. TFA has an endorsed Integrity Education Plan which ensures that all members of Touch Football receive appropriate education on integrity matters. Item 11 – Operation of Competition

The Capital Territory Cup competition will be conducted in its entirety in accordance with 8th Edition Touch Football Rules.

Rules - Touch Football Australia

Duration of matches: 25 min Touchdown Turnaround

 $\textbf{U10 Divisions} - 5 \text{ a side half field of play}. The sidelines of full field become try lines}.$

U12 – U18 Divisions – 6 athletes on field of play, Full Field.

Presentations to Champion teams of each division will be conducted at the conclusion of Grand Finals.
